1 Background

Tenders have been called for the annual resealing and pavement treatment contract.

The work covered in the tender was as follows:

- Reseal Fletcher Avenue (between SH34 and Norske carpark entrance),
 Manukorihi Drive (between SH34 and Paora), River Road (Entrance off SH34)
- Reseal Valley Road / Fenton Mill Road Roundabout
- Pavement Treatment Glasgow Street (1500m section from Bell St towards Plunket St)

Price

One tender was received.

For the roading work the price received was as follows

Fulton Hogan Limited Declined to submit price Crossroads Construction \$158,392.27

HEB Construction Limited Declined to submit price

Downer New Zealand Ltd Declined to submit a price

The following comments are made about the tenderer:

Crossroads Construction has undertaken Council's resealing in past years.

Crossroads Construction undertakes work throughout the Bay of Plenty for other councils. Their workmanship is considered to be of a high standard.

2 Options Considered

Council has the following options to consider.

a) Not accept the tender

The resealing is part of the asset renewal required to maintain the roading network and ensure that traffic safety is maintained. Waka Kotahi (NZTA) pays for 75% of the work and requires the asset to be maintained by undertaking the proposed work. While the reseal work could be delayed, it will be required to be undertaken in the future or the roads will deteriorate significantly.

This option is not recommended.

b) Accept the tender for Contract

Accepting the tender achieves the result of complying with Waka Kotahi (NZTA)'s requirements and ensures that the roading network renewals that ensure traffic safety are maintained.

This option is recommended.

3 Policy and Plan Considerations

Approving the contractors is not contrary to any of Council's Plans and Policies.

4 <u>Legal Considerations</u>

There are no legal considerations outside those normally associated with awarding a contract.

5 Community Considerations

The work is included in the Annual Plan; therefore consultation has occurred with the Community.

6 Financial Considerations

The costs for the resealing works are covered by the existing approved budgets.

7 **Summary**

Awarding the contract to the lowest tenderer is in accordance with Council's practice of selecting the lowest price conforming contractor. This is consistent with Waka Kotahi (NZTA)'s requirement. The preferred contractor is experienced and the risk of a poor standard of workmanship is low.

Construction Methodology

Initial Site Meeting with Engineer and site establishment

Prior to establishing on site, the project manager will meet on site with engineer to agree how the sites will be manged, with the least disruption to the traffic flows. Combined with the program of works and how the contractor will complete the work withing the given contract period.

We will have one establishment for each of the three sites

Traffic management,

A detailed traffic management plan will be prepared for the site and submitted for approval. No work will commence on site until an approved TMP has been granted for the project.

Traffic control will be undertaken by installing the approved TMP signage and defining public pathway around the site.

The active work site will be fenced off from public access, and secure the site when unattended by the contractor.

Location of Existing Services.

Prior to commencing excavation work, the existing services plans will be obtained and the services marked out on site.

Where excavation work is to be undertaken, Glasgow St in particular, next to or over an existing service, the crew will pot hole to expose the service prior to excavating with machinery.

Program of Works

A detailed construction program will be prepared and submitted to the engineer for approval, prior to the works being commenced.

The program will detail how the works will be constructed within the given contract time.

Implementation of Quality Systems.

A detailed construction management plan will be prepared and submitted to the engineer for approval, prior to commencing the work on site. This will detail what quality control checks will be undertaken to ensure the work is constructed in line with the contract specification.

Environmental Management

A detailed Environmental management plan will be prepared and submitted to the engineer for approval, prior to commencing the work on site. This will detail how the use of site bunding, silt socks & silt fences will be established in the drainage paths, to prevent any silt being washed into the adjoining stormwater system.
