



Kawerau Youth Councillors' input recognised by Chief Children's Commissioner

Aotearoa New Zealand's Chief Children's Commissioner Dr Claire Achmad leads Mana Mokopuna – Children and Young People's Commission.

The commission had approached the Kawerau Youth Council via former Kawerau youth worker Jordaan Tuitama who now works for the Chief Children's Commissioner, to seek feedback of Kawerau rangatahi on Doing what's RIGHT, which sets out all rights under the Children's Convention and explains them to young people.

Held in July, the workshop with the Kawerau Youth Councillors, and some 31 rangatahi in total, helped inform the new document which was presented to councillors by the Chief Children's Commissioner.

Dr Achmad outlined that in her eyes, all the youth councillors "descend from seeds of greatness and can stand in that mana and be proud of the fact that you are serving the youth council, with awesome people around you like the Mayor and JJ."

Feedback included making the headings and wording simpler to meet the needs of children, which is officially those aged 13 and younger. Better use of colour, graphics and publishing both an English and Te Reo Māori version was other feedback taken on board.

Dr Achmad said the commission would incorporate further feedback, like developing lesson plans for kaiako teachers, in future publications.

Kawerau District Council Youth Projects Officer JJ Rika also thanked the Commissioner and her team for seeking feedback from the Kawerau Youth Councillors.

"The opportunity for our Kawerau Youth Councillors to be recognised as a strong and honest voice in the motu is important."

JJ acknowledged former Kawerau-based youth worker Jordaan Tuitama for the ongoing recognition of Kawerau rangatahi through the process.

Whether you are involved in music, dance, visual arts, cultural activities, or any other creative endeavour, this is your chance to bring your project to life.

Please note, you do not have to be an incorporated society, organisation or business to apply for funding.

The grant is open to anyone who wants to showcase or teach the arts. Applicants can be from outside Kawerau, but the creative project must take place in Kawerau. Come and talk to us if you are uncertain about eligibility or your project is on the fringes of the Kawerau District.

Successful applicants will likely receive grants of less than \$5,000 and depending on how many applications the committee assess; the actual amount will vary. If you have a project in mind that is likely to be over \$5,000, there may be other funding available to make your project work.

How to talk to your mates about your decision not to drink and drive:




Be straight up – let your mates know ahead of time that you won't be drinking and that you're planning on driving home.



Suggest alternatives – offer to be the designated driver for the night, or suggest getting another friend or family member to pick you up. Let your mates know that you still want to have a good time in a safe way.

Don't judge – don't make your mates feel guilty or judged for not wanting to drink. Let them know that you're cool with them having a drink or two, but you'll be sticking to non-alcoholics.



Lead by example – showing your mates that you're committed to making responsible choices can inspire them to do the same. Be a positive influence and encourage your mates to make safe choices as well.

Summer Holiday Liquor Licensing

Plan ahead for liquor licensing applications. Event organisers who want to apply for a special license to sell or supply alcohol are reminded that they need to submit applications at least 20 working days ahead of their planned summer events. Get in early to ensure that your application can be considered. Remember between 20 December and 15 January, there are no 'working days', which means events planned for the Christmas and New Year period must have applications lodged by Wednesday, 20 November 2024. This ensures that the agencies have time to report and so licences can be issued prior to Council's Christmas closure.

Thank you for your patience while Council was fixing the taps in the New World carpark. The new filters were installed after fluoride was added to the drinking water. The taps were back up and running, but further difficulties have been experienced with the filter. Apologies as the taps are now out of service until reverse osmosis filters can be sourced and installed. In the meantime, please use the River Road drinking water taps.

Spraying of Sports Fields, Parks, and Reserves

Council wishes to advise that we have resumed the summer spraying of sports fields, parks and reserves areas for weeds and the dreaded Onehunga prickles as soon as the weather allows. Spraying will be completed (where possible) in the early hours of the day to minimise disruption to our community.
