A record-breaking crowd of more than 400 attended the Kawerau Young Achievers' Awards ceremony on Friday, 6 September at the Town Hall.

A total of 160 rangatahi received either bronze, silver, highly commended, gold, or special awards and some recipients received two or three awards! Council's youth projects officer, JJ Rika said "It was a massive night for Kawerau young people to be recognised for their sporting, academic, and cultural achievements throughout the year 2023-2024".

The ceremony started with video messages from All Black Beauden Barrett, New Zealand Women's Rugby Sevens gold medalists Michaela Blyde, Risaleaana Pouri-Lane, Portia Woodman and Tyla King, and also from Kawerau 2024 New Zealand Touch representative Elizah Ward.

Kawerau Youth Council members Sidney Waiari and Amaia Rangi MC'd the event, hyping up the crowd and introducing Mayor Faylene Tunui who encouraged the rangitahi to remember, "When you go out and represent the country one day, know you will always be representing Kawerau."





Drinking water fluoridation

In June, Council received an extension up until September 30, 2024, from the Director-General of Health to complete the installation of fluoridation infrastructure. This has now been completed and the Ministry of Health has fully funded the project of \$457,980 for this work. The Ministry of Health

has advised Council that it will need to start adding fluoride to the water as per the directive we received on 22 July 2022. Council appreciates that there are different views in the community about fluoridation, albeit Council cannot risk the \$200,000 fine (and subsequent \$10,000 per day fine) to go against this directive. This means fluoridation will start on Monday, 30 September 2024.

Please note, the taps at New World have filters that currently takes out the chorine and will also remove fluoride. The River Road taps will remain chlorine and fluoride free.

Council becomes more sustainable

Council is on a mission to be more sustainable and recently installed six solar panels on the Council building roof and a tesla battery in our server room. The environmental impact of using the new system is huge, Council will reduce CO2 emissions by 34% which is the same as one ton of CO2 being avoided each year. By implementing the new system, it will benefit the environment in the same way as planting 185 trees or avoiding driving a car 90,472km. It also means Council has a back-up power source for phones in the event of a power outage or natural disaster.

The cost to implement the solar panels and battery costs \$31,027. Over the next 11 years Council estimates that we will have a net saving of \$37,993.
